1 ON WHY ORGANIZATION IS ESSENTIAL:

l've never embraced my iPhone. I always have my calendar and address book in front of me. My orderliness has been handy for editing and merchandising.

6 ON HER FAVORITE SILHOUETTE FOR SPRING:

8 ON THE JENNI KAYNE WOMAN:


I design for women who love beautiful, timeless clothes. Since I became a mother, my collection has become more practical. I want clothes that are not too precious—that allow me to sit on the floor.
